I was in one of our small villages a few weeks ago, visiting the nightly open gym where villagers of all ages come to play or watch basketball. I introduced myself to a grandma and she exclaimed, "Nate Davis? I remember you from Tanalian Bible Camp in the '70s when we were both in junior high camp!" It turns out that this dear lady believed in the resurrection of Jesus at TBC forty years ago. She is a strong leader in her village to this day.

Back in the '70s, only 20-30 children a year came to camp at TBC. Now, hundreds of village children come face to face with the living Jesus every summer at TBC. But, we need your help. In remote Alaska it costs \$300 to \$1000 in airfare alone for children to make it to camp. We

have a wonderful scholarship fund that makes it possible for more than 100 campers each year to be able to afford camp.

It is the resurrection of Jesus that changes everything! Now the Resurrection of Jesus brings good news to the afflicted! He heals the brokenhearted! Jesus Christ proclaims liberty to captives and freedom to prisoners! Because Jesus lives again, everyone who is in Jesus is a new creature! Everyone who believes in the One who first conquered the grave, has hope that he or she will also conquer the grave! Jesus rose again and this changes everything!



For that one girl, it undoubtedly was, but this year the story continued to unfold. Sending a young camper who has just accepted Christ at camp back to some of the most difficult and unsupportive environments back home can be gut wrenching. Will they be able to follow the Lord? Will they grow? What are the people in the village going to say? Will we get to see them again?

When this camper went home she wanted the other kids in her village to have the same experience, but

she was the only believer in the village except for one full time ministry couple. Her excitement for the Lord, combined with some amazing circumstances in the village, resulted in not just one student from the village coming to camp this year, but ten!

Among the kids who came, several gave their lives to Christ and wanted to know if there was anyone back home who believed the same thing. It was so great to be able to help them identify and connect to the ministry couple who lives with them year round. Villages can be difficult and spiritually dark places where change often happens slowly, so to see the growth from one camper to

ten in just a year, is amazing.

All of this started because one little girl was able to come to camp, received love like never before, accepted the Lord, and faithfully shared back home. This changes everything.

Aaron: Charles, why did you want to go to TBC?

Charles: My mom and others in my village encouraged me to go. Dena'ina Air Taxi pays for everyone in my village to go, so I was able to. All we needed to do was bring money for the snack shop!

A: Do you remember anything from your first year as a camper?

C: Andrew Rowland was my counselor! He was awesome and made it fun when it needed to be but was also good about making it serious. He was easy to talk to and explain stuff. I could tell this place was different because everyone loved God and He set this place aside.

A: We met at Spring Family Conference last year and you were already excited about coming to TLC. What was going on then and now?

C: Yeah, that was one of the first steps in me giving my whole self to the Lord. I started to accept and open my eyes and heart to Him even more. I'm really happy to be back here at the TLC program. It's made me have a better relationship with God. I've learned believing in Christ just takes your heart, soul, giving yourself up to him and following Him and loving Him and believing.

A: That's awesome, and you just got baptized here?

C: It was the most amazing feeling, getting baptized. When I went into the water and came back up it's like everything just left my whole body, I felt the love for the Lord and giving myself up to Him, and leaving everything behind, and I got to give the glory to Him on that. He's changed my life and I'm so thankful for that. I'm getting a better understanding of the Bible and what God is going to use me for.

A: So what do you think He's going to use you for after TLC?

C: Preaching: I want to be a pilot. I want to be able to fly around and to have a better understanding of the Bible. I want to show them how it feels to be loved. To share what I hold dear for myself.

A: What else are you looking forward to this year at TLC?

C: I want to strengthen my relationship with God and with other people in town. I want to know how to put on the armor before I go into battle for the Lord. I can learn from others' strengths here. It's great to see how God uses people's stories and changes their lives. It gives me the holy bumps, hahaha.

Charles is in the aviation program at TLC and is both actively working towards his private pilot license and being immersed in the Word of God during Bible Class each day.
